

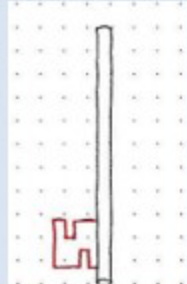
Directions

**Starting with Pencil,
 Draw the RED Ink in
 Each Step. Then Ink
 All Lines.
 Erase Pencil. Color.**

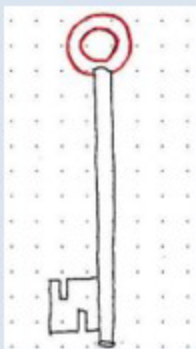
#1. In pencil, draw an upright tube. This will be 11 units tall and $\frac{1}{4}$ unit wide. Close top with a domed line and bottom with an ellipse.



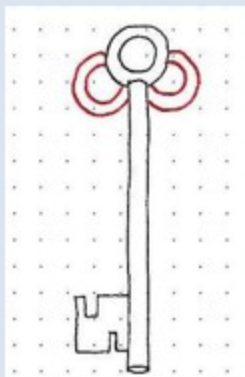
#2. Draw a box on the lower left that is about 2 units square. Make offset notches at the top and bottom.



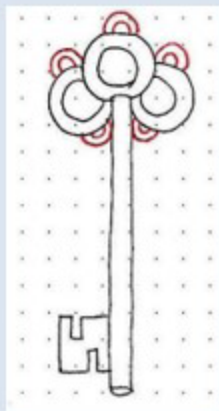
#3. Add a double-lined circle at the top. The inner ring floats above the dome and the outer ring meets the tube at the edge of the dome.



#3. Draw rings of the same size on each side of the center ring. Their inner circles join the tube where the domed top ends.



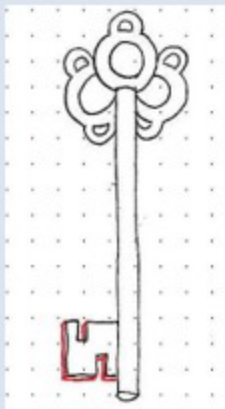
#4. Draw smaller double-lined half-loops at the top of all three circles and at the bottoms of the two outer circles.



#5. Add a drop-shadow to the lower left of the notched box.

#6. Ink all, leaving blank where the small loops join their larger hosts.

#7. Erase pencil.



#8. If you use a thinner pen for your inking, make TWO passes over all the lines for a more vintage look to the key.

#9. Add tiny hash marks along the edges of the shaft and the circles to give the key a more rounded feel.

#10. Color to look like gold, silver or brass.
