

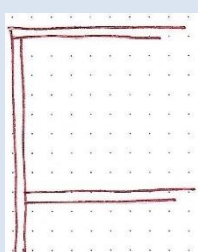


CBJ DRAWING LESSONS

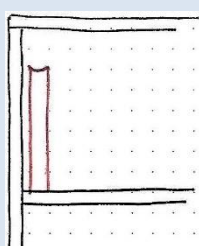
#D19-23 "Bookshelf"

DIRECTIONS: P-I-E (Pencil, Ink, Erase) First use PENCIL, Draw the Red ink in each step. Then INK all lines, ERASE Pencil. COLOR

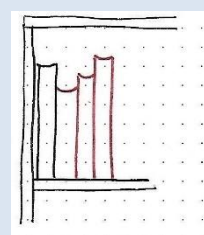
#1. In pencil, lightly make guidelines to draw left top and bottom double lines to the height you want for ONE shelf of your bookcase.



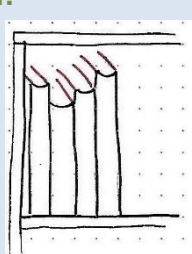
#2. On left side, draw a rectangle, slightly spaced from the left wall. It will have a curved top.



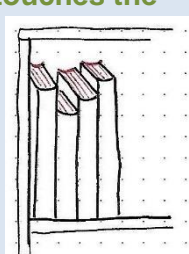
#3. Add more rectangles with varying heights and widths, sitting on the baseline and all sharing common lines where they touch one another.



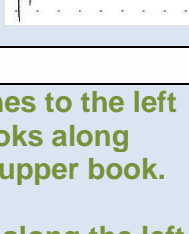
#4. From the top of every tip of each curved line, make a 45-degree line toward upper left. Note that on a shorter book this line would pass behind the book to its left so you can leave that line off.



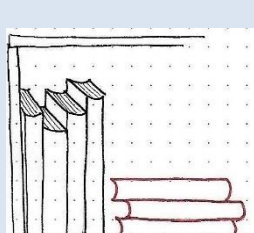
#5. Close the tops of those angled lines with curves matching those in the front (when the back is visible). Draw the vertical lines on the left edge of each back curve down to where it touches the book on its left.



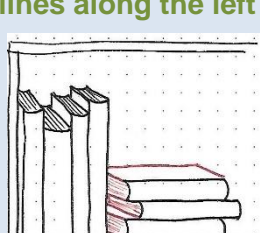
#6. Add fine lines along the angled section to represent the book pages.



#7. On the right side of the shelf, add three horizontal rectangles with curved edges. Stagger the ends as shown.



#8. Add angled lines to the left sides of these books along with a top for the upper book.



#9. Add fine lines along the left angled sections to represent the book pages.

#10. Extend your bookshelf lines to create more shelves and add different configurations of books to them.

#11. Ink all lines. Erase pencil. Color as desired.
