



# CBJ DRAWING LESSONS

## #D19-37 "Raindrops"

**DIRECTIONS:** P-I-E (Pencil, Ink, Erase) First use **PENCIL**, Draw the **Red ink** in each step. Then **INK** all lines, **ERASE** Pencil. **COLOR**

**#1.** Because we will be creating raindrops on colored background you will need to have different supplies at hand. You will need 1) a colored pencil for your background 2) a colored pencil several shades darker within the same color family 3) a white colored pencil 4) white gel pen or paint pen.

**#2.** Lightly indicate your chosen shape (circle or oval) using the background color.



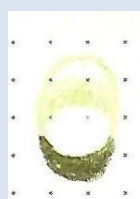
**#3.** With the darker colored pencil draw and fill in a crescent below your guideline shape.



**#4.** Use the white pencil to color in a circular area at the bottom half of the guide shape. (You can't see it, but it is there).



**#5.** Above the white area, color an arc of the background color.



**#6.** At the top of the guide shape, add a final arc using a light touch with the darker pencil.



**#7.** Use the white pencil over the whole surface of the guide shape. Your goal is to blend the arcs into a smooth blend.



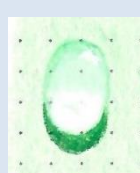
**#8.** With the white gel pen or paint pen add a bright white highlight near the top, just to the right of center.



**#9.** Color the background object.



**#10.** This works with any color! Here are samples on gray and teal.



**#11.** Keep in mind that, if you are adding more than one water drop to make all of them the same shape (all round or all oval) but vary the sizes.
