


## CBJ DRAWING LESSONS

## #D19-46 "Mason Jar"

DIRECTIONS: P-I-E (Pencil, Ink, Erase) First use PENCIL, Draw the Red ink in each step. Then INK all lines, ERASE Pencil. COLOR


#1. In pencil, lightly draw a guide box that is 12 units high and 7 units wide.





#4. Turn the lower edge of the top rectangle into a dipped line that matches the upper oval.

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unit. You may have either two or three. They need to overlap and must touch the edges.

#6. Draw hashmarks under the curved edge. They will be 1/3 unit inside the outer edge of the lid and 1/3 unit high.




#7. Connect the hashmarks with the outer edges of the large rectangle by making sloping shoulders. They should meet at 3 units from the top edge.

#8. In the lower corners, make curves out of the last unit on each side. Connect these with a dipped line that rests just below the bottom edge of the rectangle.

#9. Draw a short dipping line just over 1 unit from the bottom edge of the lid.

#10. At the bottom, make a 'C' curve about 1 unit high that fits inside the left and lower edge.




#11. Around the sides, make broken lines that fit about ½ unit inside the jar edges, following the curves of the sides.



#12. Trace lines in ink and erase pencil.
